The chin appears a little advanced and the lips are thin and closed. The ears appear elongated. The head has a horizontal termination at the lower end. From the proportionally much smaller body extend the two indicated arms, which end in slender hands with recognizable fingers. At the same level is a loincloth. Directly below, the figure ends with a broad base.
